Course Description

This course enables students to read New Testament Greek. The result will be the equipping of the student to interpret the books and letters of the New Testament. An emphasis is placed upon grammar and vocabulary. Some consideration is given to the practice of translation. The course, Greek 1, is the first of two semesters of Greek grammar offered through the College of Undergraduate Studies. The student should plan on completing both semester length courses in order to have an understanding of New Testament Greek. Each course (Greek 1 and Greek 2) is three hours in credit for a total of six semester hours of Greek if both courses are completed.

- 1. Have a basic vocabulary of New Testament Greek.
