What do Christian clients want regarding prayer in counseling?

Strong expectations prayer would be included in counseling
Want therapists to pray outside session

Religious conservatives had higher expectations for prayer

Prayer...

**most frequently used spiritual intervention
by Christian counselors**

78% in Christian agencies

100% pray in Christian private practices

Most research studied

When prayer was used (in session, out of session)


Attitudes toward prayer by therapists/clients

What spiritual interventions used by therapists

Scant research: studying types of prayer and efficacy of prayer in counseling

Frequent prayer by clients related to high mental health scores regardless of age or gender

Intercessory prayer (distant) with depressed clients had significant effect on cognitive symptoms of depression.

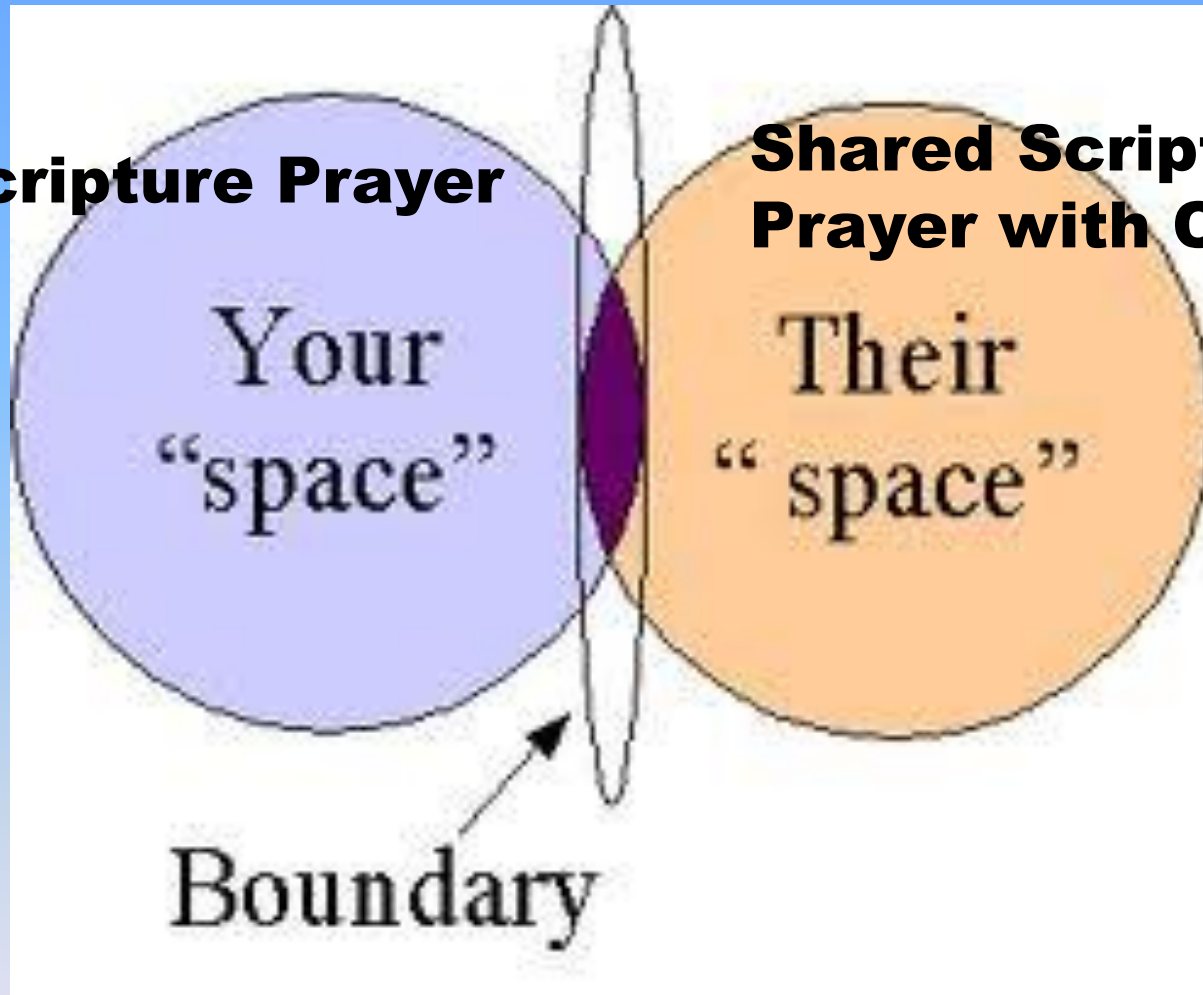

- Spirituality or religious issues (client or therapist?)
- Do no harm
- Informed consent (risks)
- Welfare of Client (respect/do not ignore)

Objective 3

Ask God to Give You Wisdom to Know How to Pray

- As you read the Scriptures daily, ask God to guide you to see truths that you could ask God to bring about in the life of your client.
- As you think about their presenting problems, allow God to direct you to see underlying issues that only He can impact.

Philippians 4:4-7

- 4. Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! 5. Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. 6. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

- 8. finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.
